The Health Sciences Associate of Science (A.S.) degree at Motlow State Community College provides a course of study for students who want to pursue a career in health care. Some students enter this pathway and then, if accepted, transfer into a nursing program or an allied health program.

The associate degree in Health Sciences prepares graduates to work in diverse roles in the healthcare industry. Students who earn their Health Sciences A.S. degrees leave Motlow with a broad educational foundation in anatomy, physiology, biology, chemistry, nutrition, pathophysiology, and physics.

Students who enroll in Health Sciences learn how to improve individual and public health through the lens of science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM).
