NURSING | One-Year LPN to RN Path

The Nursing Program offers a three-semester transition program for LPNs who seek to become a Registered Nurse.

The Associate of Applied Science (A.A.S.) nursing program prepares you to apply to take the National Council Licensure Examination for the Registered Nurse (NCLEX-RN).

The three-semester curriculum emphasizes the application of the nursing core competencies: professional behavior, communication, assessment, clinical decision making, caring intervention, teaching and learning, collaboration, and managing care of a diverse client population.

REQUIREMENTS FOR LPN-RN APPLICANTS

To be considered for admission to the Nursing Program at Motlow State, students must first apply, submit required documents, including all transcripts, and be admitted to the college. Prospective nursing students will declare Health Sciences as their major until accepted into the Nursing Program. The Nursing Program admission is competitive, and admission to the college does not guarantee admission to the Nursing Program.

- Take the HESI Nursing Fundamentals exam. If you took the Nursing Fundamentals exam at another college, or if you wish to use a HESI score from a prior year, order your transcript from Elsevier and have them email the transcript to nursingeducation@mscc.edu by the application deadline.
- Have a grade point average (GPA) of 2.75 or greater on a 4.0 scale (GPA is calculated only on the completed general education courses required by the Nursing Program at the time of application).
- Be a graduate of an accredited practical nurse program.
- Email a scanned copy of an LPN license to nursingeducation@mscc.edu by the application deadline of January 31 at 4:30 p.m. CST.

WHY STUDY NURSING AT MOTLOW

Clinical activities are provided in campus classrooms, area hospitals, extended care facilities, and other health and community agencies. While the majority of the clinical experiences are located within the college's 11-county service area, additional travel is sometimes required.
