The Associate of Science (A.S.) degree in Special Education at Motlow State Community College prepares you for transfer to a university through the Tennessee Transfer Pathway (TTP). TTPs enable you to complete your degree at Motlow and then transfer to any Tennessee public university, and several Tennessee private universities, as a junior to complete your bachelor's degree.

Special education courses include instruction on early childhood education, child and adolescent developmental psychology, and inclusive teaching. Students who complete this course of study are qualified to work as teacher's aides, special education tutors, and learning disability specialists.
