**Articulation Agreement
Athens State University
And
Motlow State Community College**

This articulation agreement outlines a joint program of study between Athens State University and Motlow State Community College. The agreement specifies which courses may be taken and transferred from the Associate of Science (A.S.) Degree at Motlow State to meet general education, major, and elective requirements for the B.S. in Biology with Bioinformatics option.

Motlow State students who follow the program of study outlined in the respective articulation agreement are given academic credit for courses listed in the curriculum matrix. In the event of program revisions at Athens or Motlow State, this agreement is subject to revision. This agreement is in accordance with guidelines established by the Tennessee Board of Regents (TBR) for articulation agreements between community colleges and universities.

The 2+2 program of study outlined below leads to the **Associate of Science (A.S.)** degree, Bioinformatics Emphasis, from Motlow State Community College (MSCC) and a **Bachelor of Science (B.S.)** degree in **Biology- Bioinformatics Option** from Athens State University. This articulation agreement recognizes the following course work is needed to complete an A.S. degree at Motlow State Community College.

Total Semester Hours Credit: 61-62 (See notes below)

All Bioinformatics majors who are required to take Learning Support must also complete MSCC 1300-First Year Experience, and the degree program will require 64-65 credit hours.

Condition(s) for transfer

- This articulation agreement applies only to the B.S. degree in Biology – Bioinformatics Option. Any future changes to the degree program may not be applicable to this agreement and may necessitate renegotiation.
- A change of major invalidates these courses/credits for transfer unless they are approved within some other program-to-program articulation agreement for a different major at Athens.
- A minimum 2.00 Grade Point Average (GPA) is required for transferable credit.

Term – This Agreement will be effective from the date of final signature below, the Effective Date, until terminated in writing by either party. It is agreed that if terminated, both institutions will honor the terms of the Agreement until the end of the next admissions applications and review period of Athens State.

Post-Termination- Upon expiration or termination of this Agreement for any reason, Motlow State students previously accepted by or admitted to Athens State shall continue to receive the benefits contemplated by this Agreement.

Non-discrimination

The parties agree to comply with Titles VI and VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, Executive Order 11,246, the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 and the related regulations to each. Each party assures that it will not discriminate against any individual including, but not limited to, employees or applicants for employment and/or students because of race, religion, creed, color, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity/expression, age, disability, veteran status, genetic information, national origin, or any other legally protected class with respect to all employment, programs and activities.

The parties also agree to take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed and that employees are treated during their employment without regard to their race, religion, creed, color, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity/ expression, age, disability, veteran status, genetic information, national origin, or any other legally protected class. . Such action shall include, but not be limited to, the following: employment, upgrading, demotion or transfer, recruitment or recruitment advertising, layoff or termination, rates of pay or other forms of compensation, and selection available to employees and applicants for employment to the extent that such laws are applicable to each party individually.

Binding agreement. This Agreement shall not be binding upon the parties until it is approved by the president or designee and the Tennessee Board of Regents.

Governing Law. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Tennessee without regard to its conflict of law provisions.

Confidentiality of Records. All educational records created, disclosed, or maintained pursuant to the terms of this Agreement are confidential and shall be created, disclosed, and maintained pursuant to the provisions of Family Educational Right to Privacy Act, also known as FERPA (20 U.S.C.A. s1232g) and its regulations.

Notices. All notices or other written communications relating to termination, expiration, or any other legal matter relating to this Agreement will be effective when received and must be given in writing by courier or reputable overnight delivery service, or by certified mail, return receipt requested, to either party at the following address (or to such other address as such party may substitute, by providing a written notice.)


