#### 2+2 Articulation/Transfer Agreement Middle Tennessee State University Elementary & Special Education Department And Motlow State Community College Smyrna Center Education Department

THIS ARTICULATION AGREEMENT (the "Agreement") is entered into on <u>February 9, 2015</u>, by and between Middle Tennessee State University ("MTSU") and Motlow State Community College ("MSCC"). The parties desire to enter into a contract pursuant to which students of MSCC – Smyrna Center will be eligible for articulated course credits at MTSU, according to the terms contained in this Agreement.

**ACCORDINGLY**, in consideration of the promises and mutual covenants contained in this Agreement, and of other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the parties agree as follows:

#### 1. Description of Articulation Program.

- a. Definitions. Articulation criteria is defined in Attachment A.
- b. <u>Purpose</u>. The purpose of this Agreement is to facilitate the transfer of MSCC- Smyrna Center students to MTSU; to provide specific advisement for MSCC students who intend to transfer to MTSU; and, to encourage academic and administrative coordination between the institutions in the following program:
  - Interdisciplinary Studies K-6

Attachment A, "Program of Study" outlines courses that must be taken at MSCC – Smyrna Center to earn an Associate of Science in Teaching which will transfer as a block for the first 60 hours of the Bachelor of Science in Interdisciplinary Studies K-6 at MTSU. A listing of the MTSU upper division courses that students shall be required to complete in order to earn a Bachelor of Science in Interdisciplinary Studies K-6 degree through MTSU is provided as well.

In compliance with TBR Guideline A-031, the following has been determined:

- Competencies that indicate that the learning outcomes specified in courses offered by MSCC satisfy learning outcomes in similar courses offered by MTSU. Syllabi and competency lists of the courses from the institutions involved must be maintained in the appropriate offices of both institutions;
- Descriptions of required proficiency levels and criteria for measurement; and
- The evaluation plan and process.
- c. <u>Semester meetings</u>. MTSU commits to holding one or more mandatory 'in-person' meetings at the Motlow State Community College Smyrna Center each semester to address questions and facilitate the transfer process.

- d. <u>Annual review</u>. This Agreement will be subject to annual review by representatives of each institution. Any recommendations for revisions will be made in writing and reviewed by each institution's respective Chief Academic Officer or their designees. The articulation requirements of this Agreement may only be amended in the form of an Amendment signed by authorized representatives of the parties and the Tennessee Board of Regents.
- e. <u>Admission requirements</u>. MSCC students wishing to transfer credits to MTSU within the Bachelor of Science in Interdisciplinary Studies K-6 degree program must meet the admissions requirements for MTSU. These students must supply an official MSCC transcript of degree completion to MTSU. The completed AST degree from MSCC is required for admission to the BS at MTSU. If admitted, the students shall become subject to all MTSU policies, procedures and rules.
- f. <u>Focus on articulation</u>. This Agreement is in keeping with the Tennessee Board of Regents focus on partnership and collaboration between TBR institutions.
- g. <u>Non-Exclusivity</u>. This Agreement is not exclusive, and either party may enter into similar agreements with any other party.

#### 2. Term and Termination.

- a. <u>Term</u>. This Agreement will be effective from the date of final signature below, the Effective Date, until terminated in writing by either party. It is agreed that if terminated, both institutions will honor the terms of the Agreement until the end of the next admissions application and review period of MTSU.
- b. <u>Post-Termination</u>. Upon termination of this Agreement for any reason, MC students previously accepted by or admitted to MTSU shall continue to receive the benefits contemplated by this Agreement.

#### 3. Miscellaneous.

a. <u>Non-discrimination</u>. The parties agree to comply with Titles VI and VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, Executive Order 11,246, the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 and the related regulations to each. Each party assures that it will not discriminate against any individual including, but not limited to, employees or applicants for employment and/or students because of race, religion, creed, color, sex, age, disability, veteran status or national origin.

The parties also agree to take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed and that employees are treated during their employment without regard to their race, religion, creed, color, sex, age, disability, veteran status, or national origin. Such action shall include, but not be limited to, the following: employment, upgrading, demotion or transfer, recruitment or recruitment advertising, layoff or termination, rates of pay or other forms of compensation, and selection available to employees and applicants for employment.

b. <u>Binding agreement</u>. This Agreement shall not be binding upon the parties until it is approved by the president or designee and the Tennessee Board of Regents.

- d. <u>Governing Law</u>. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Tennessee without regard to its conflict of laws provisions.
- e. <u>Notices</u>. All notices or other written communications relating to termination, expiration, or any other legal matter relating to this Agreement will be effective when received and must be given in writing by courier or reputable overnight delivery service, or by certified mail, return receipt requested, to either party at the following address (or to such other address as such party may substitute, by providing a written notice.)

- f. <u>Waivers</u>. The waiver by either party of any provision of this Agreement on any occasion and upon any particular circumstance shall not operate as a waiver of such provision of this Agreement on any other occasion or upon any other circumstance.
- h. <u>Complete Agreement; Integration</u>. This Agreement contains the complete understanding of the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and supersedes all other agreements, understandings, communications and promises of any kind, whether oral or written, between the parties with respect to such subject matter.
- i. <u>Counterparts; Facsimile Signatures.</u> This Agreement may be executed in multiple counterparts, all of which shall be originals and which together shall constitute a single agreement. For the purpose of interpreting this Agreement, facsimile signatures shall be considered equivalent to original signatures.



- Independent Contractors. The parties are independent contractors, and no agency, j. partnership, franchise, joint venture, or employment relationship is intended or created by this Agreement. Neither party shall make any commitment, or give the impression that it has authority to make any commitment, on behalf of the other party.
- Confidentiality of Records. All educational records created, disclosed, or maintained k. pursuant to the terms of this Agreement are confidential and shall be created, disclosed, and maintained pursuant to the provisions of Family Educational Right to Privacy Act, also known as FERPA (20 U.S.C.A. s1232g) and its regulations.
- TBR Guideline P-080: Discrimination and Harassment Complaint Investigation and Ι. Procedure: This Tennessee Board of Regents guideline provides for investigation and resolution of complaints of discrimination or harassment on the basis of race, color, religion, creed, ethnic or national origin, gender identity/expression, disability, age, status as a covered veteran, genetic information, and any other category protected by federal or state civil rights law. Any student or employee who believes s/he has been subjected to, or is aware of, discrimination or harassment, should use the procedure for reporting and resolution of discrimination or harassment complaints. Student and employees are required to be knowledgeable of policies and guidelines, report suspected violations to the Director of Human Resources, and cooperate with investigations. Damages recoverable against the State shall be expressly limited to claims paid by the Claims Commission pursuant to T.C.A. 9-8-301 et seq.
